



Paragliding

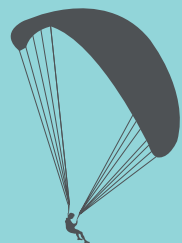
When flying in airspace over closely populated areas you must maintain a minimum height of 300m AGL and always have enough altitude to glide to a safe landing outside the populated area.

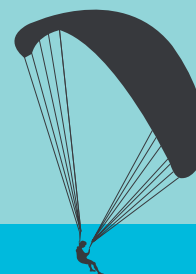

When flying below a height of 300m AGL we always strive not to fly close to private houses, and we never fly over large groups of people or buildings.

- Say hello to the locals.
- Follow the local rules.

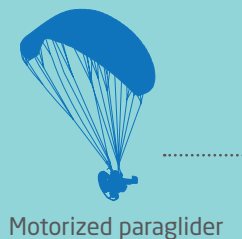

Airmanship is about applying good judgement and knowledge at all times during all phases of flight .

This means that pilots should always:

- Have the necessary knowledge to complete the planned flight.
- Fly in conditions that do not exceed their skills
- Have a good attitude in relation to the surroundings, conditions, rules and the planned flight.
- Apply good judgement in all phases of flight.
- Aim to have a minimal impact on the surroundings and observe the minimum distances and altitudes.
- Strive to always maintain a safe horizontal and vertical distance so that they don't disturb people and grazing animals.
- Avoid making unnecessary noise.



At least 300m over the highest obstacle within a radius of 600m and always enough altitude to glide to a safe landing.
